Leawood, Kansas was a town that was created during the Santa Fe trail expedition after the Louisiana purchase in 1803. In the early 20th century Leawood was officially established but would not have a big housing development until 1948. Leawood now is consider one of the wealthiest suburbs in the Kansas City metropolitan area.⁴

She was the 2nd of three children. She attended Shawnee Mission South for high school and then went to Pittsburg State University for college.

She dropped out to marry her husband **John Collar**. Dona had her first child **Amy Collar Hunter** so she would stay home with her and raise her while her husband John would go to work. They then had their second child Tim six years after Amy and Dona would also choose to stay home and raise him as well. In the summers she would help her husband and her brother in laws run the fireworks stands for their company. They resided in Overland Park most of their life with her children. She has 5 grandchildren that she loves very much.

In figure 4.11 it shows a graph of couples electing to have smaller families rather than the baby boom. In the graph it shows that the year 1973 the ideal amount was about 3 children, but the actual amount was more towards two children. Dona had her first child in 1973 so she

was more towards the actual side rather than the ideal side. She then had her next and last child six years later. The Collars had met the actual side like a lot of America. These dates were way after World War 2 but the country had lost so many men in the war reproducing was vital to keep the country running in the future. Dona did not meet the ideal expectations of the country, but she fell into the actual amount of children by the time she was done having kids.⁹

John Collar (1945-) was born on February 10, 1945. He is the oldest of 7 children and was born and raised in Pittsburg, KS.¹⁰ He attended St. Mary's Colgan for grade school all through high school. He then attended Pittsburg State University to earn his degree and then took a job at the IRS. One of his brothers started a fireworks business with him and it has been built into a very successful company called Black Cat and Winco. John, He has two children **Amy Collar Hunter and Tim Collar**. He also has 5 grandchildren that help him with fireworks every summer.

Sharon Kay Mcinerney (1945-2012)¹¹ was born on August 7, 1944, in Wichita, KS but moved to Cottonwood Falls, KS right after she was born. She had two siblings, one brother and one sister. She moved to Kansas City in 1959 where she met her husband, **Gary Hunter**. She birthed two boys Todd and **Bryan Hunter**. Her husband left her for reasons unknown, so she was left with two boys to raise, and she was the only income to help with the two boys. She had a job at the Kansas

City women's clinic a lot of her life but then would make her company Plaza Personnel, a medical staffing agency. She received an award as one of the best small businesses in the Kansas City area. She passed away from blood cancer in 2012 leaving 2 two boys and 5 grandchildren behind.¹²

Cottonwood Falls, Kansas where Sharon grew up was deemed a city in 1859 in the Kansas territory and the county Chase. The first settlement was in 1854 by an Indian trader named Seth Hayes after he founded a cattle ranch by the Cottonwood River. It has historically had a small population peaking at 1,078 people in 1940 and the last recorded population in 2020 being 851 people. Cottonwood Falls is mainly known for having farms and cattle ranches which would be the main source of income for most of its citizens.¹³

Sharon remarried in the fall of 1987 to Phil Mcinerney making Phil Bryans new stepfather. Sharon was now with the new love of her life, and she was also the mother to 3 more boys, Pat, Kevin, and Bryan. Phil would pass away in the year 2001 leaving behind three sons, two stepsons and three grandchildren. Sharon was now widowed and chose to move in with her son Bryan Hunter and would reside there for 2 years.¹⁴ She was in a state of mourn for these years but also found it to be a great opportunity to grow close with her newborn grandchild John. Sharon would move out right before the birth of her third grandchild, Paige Hunter. Sharon would now move back into her own home and went

back to her business. In 2012 Sharon sadly passed away due to blood cancer after a long battle.

Gary Hunter (1942-2020) birthday is December 14, 1942, and was the son of a husbandless mother. His father was an alcoholic and was never around for his life. He was the same way with his children, never around. He had two boys Todd and Bryan, which have turned out to be very successful fathers and husbands. Gary passed away to do health problems in 2020 and his sons do not like to speak of him very much.¹⁵ When the author interviewed **Bryan Hunter (1971-)** he did not elect to talk about his father much but he did say that his father **Gary Hunter (1942-2020)** a police officer when he was a little kid and he knew that he remarried but he then did not chose to say anymore because he did not know anything about his father.

Lorraine Gige Pavey (1922-2018)¹⁶ was born on 26 December 1922 in Osseo, Minnesota.¹⁷ She had one sibling, Donald Gigley who is also deceased and she is survived by her three children Tom Pavey, **Dona Pavey Collar (1951-)** and Debbie Peters.

Osseo, Minnesota was settled long before the local government organized it as a city. Before becoming Osseo, it was called Palestine and was home to many Native Americans. Many settlers such as French Canadians, New Englanders, Swiss, and Germans removed the Native Americans making it their territory in the late 1800s. These new settlers were known for their blacksmith, wagonmakers, shoemakers, and many more. Osseo was finally in city government on the date March 17, 1875.

Lorraine Gige Pavey (1922-2018) was a hard-working woman and after graduating high school started to work at Minneapolis¹⁸ power and light.¹⁹ This is where she met her husband **Donald Pavey (1921-2018)** and they fell in love and they would get married on May 16, 1942. After

residing in Minneapolis for the first 12 years of their marriage but would then move to Overland Park, KS.²⁰ The first thing that **Lorraine Gigle Pavey (1922-2018)** did when she got settled in her new home was find a church for her family. Her faith was very important to her, probably the most important thing to her and her family. They became parishioners at Mt. Olive Evangelical Church and were members until her passing.

Donald Pavey (1921-2018)²¹ was born on December 13, 1921, in Minneapolis, Minnesota.²² After graduating from North High School he got a job at coast-to-coast hardware store but shortly after graduated high school World War two was underway, so he elected in the summer of 1942 to serve his country and join the United States Coast Guard where he was assigned to destroyer escort 385²³. In this Newspaper story it talks about how destroyer escorts were called the servants of the sea. Destroyer escorts are some of the most powerful ships not only in the United States Navy and Coast Guard but in all the world. This is important to **Donald Pavey (1921-2018)** because all during World War two he served on one of these mighty ships.

In figure 2.2 it shows the high school graduation rate for each region in the country. **Donald Pavey (1921-2018)** being from the Midwest was given a less than 50% chance of graduating high school. He

beat the odds that were against him and when it comes to mind nowadays everyone graduates high school it feels like, but this module puts it into perspective on how hard you had to work to graduate high school let alone college.²⁴

After the war was over, he came back home to his family and went back to work for coast-to-coast for his entire life, working there for 43 years. He developed a love for sports through his whole life and would go to the local high school football game every Friday night. He loved this sport so much that he passed on this love to his son Tom, his grandson Tim, and his great-grand grandchildren **John Hunter (2000-)** and Brady Collar. **John Hunter (2000-)** earliest memories of **Donald Pavey (1921-2018)** was when they went to the blue valley high school football game. **Donald Pavey (1921-2018)** also had the biggest, sweet tooth.²⁵ He always had ice cream whether it was for his children, grandchildren, or great-grandchildren. **Donald Pavey (1921-2018)** sadly passed away in 2018.

Rosemary Lyons Collar (1924-1980)²⁶ was born on August 14, 1924, in Pittsburg, Kansas. She was one of two children while she was the oldest. **Rosemary Lyons Collar (1924-1980)** was born to John Lyons and Mary Keegan Lyons. She was born and raised Catholic and attended Saint Mary's Colgan all through grade school. She would remain in Pittsburg, Kansas²⁷ her whole life and would meet her husband **Charles Collar (1917-1998)**. **Rosemary Lyons Collar (1924-1980)** elected to not go to

college and started her family with her husband shortly after she graduated high school. They bore seven children and raised them in Pittsburg since her and her husband were both from there, she thought it would be the best place to raise their children. **Rosemary Lyons Collar (1924-1980)** never took a job and thought she should stay home and raise the children. She did develop a passion for gardening and loved doing it. She had a big vegetable garden in her backyard and would take very good care of it and would use a lot of the vegetables she picked for their meals. She would make a fresh salad almost every night and especially on Sunday nights. She loved Sundays because her and her family would go to church and then she would get to make her favorite meal that night, some sort of fish with a fresh garden salad.²⁸ **Rosemary Lyons Collar (1924-1980)** sadly passed away in 1980.
